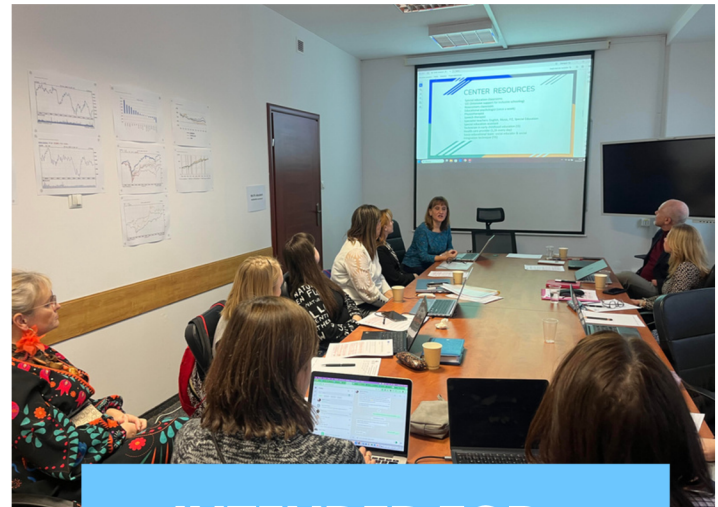
OUR PROJECT

The CARE project aims to support the integration of migrant students into multilingual educational systems by developing innovative tools and methodologies for language learning. Through tailored outputs such as a Methodological Guidebook, CLIL-based language courses, a digital mentoring programme, and an E-platform, the project empowers educators to create inclusive, effective learning environments. CARE promotes linguistic and cultural inclusion, fostering academic success and social cohesion.

1st PARTNER MEETING

On December 10th and 11th, the project partners gathered in person to engage in an in-depth discussion about the project objectives, key activities, expected outcomes, and upcoming tasks. The meeting provided an excellent opportunity for the partners to connect, share insights about their respective organizations, and exchange best practices related to the project topic.

- pupils aged 11-14 (BICS and CALP modules in the language of schooling; level A1-B2; emphasis on public speeches, self-presentation) from migrant families;

4. E-platform gathering all outputs and enabling teachers to share their experiences, learning materials, comments, feedback and ideas.
